

Seventh Sunday of Easter

A few months ago, I had the singular privilege of a private meeting with Pope Francis. We were a small group of pastors, composed largely of non-Catholics. The Holy Father wished to discuss our work for Christian unity. The phrase I remember him saying with greatest frequency was: *Tutti dentro*. It

means, "Everyone in." He clearly wanted us to emphasize that the Church is made for the whole human race, not a select few. At the center of his concern was unity. We are all brothers and sisters, he said multiple times. The Church's primary longing is for everyone to join Her.

This longing is at the heart of this Ascension feast day. We hear the longest recorded prayer of the one whom Pope Francis represents. Jesus' concern is unity, praying to the Father, "that they may be one, even as we are one" (John 17:11). The deep unity of all people in Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit is what Jesus most desires. It is what he ascends to accomplish.

Do we have this same burning desire in our hearts, too? Or do we see Christian unity as an unrealizable dream? Or worse, as something that threatens our own narrow tribal interests? This feast is a wonderful time to consider our attitude toward Christian unity, and to commit to do whatever we can to foster it. It is the Pope's desire because it is that of Jesus — and it should be ours, too.



PARISH HISTORY Part 10

July 6, 1952 – Masses in Winnisquam: 7-9-11am No Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament at the Church during the summer months.

July 20 – Nest Sunday, we will take up a monthly collection. Please try to be generous. Must pay over \$400. for insurance.

August 3 – We are again asking each family to kindly accept raffle tickets and to cooperate by disposing them. The success of our lawn party depends a lot on the sale of the tickets which in turn can only succeed with every family doing their little share.

August 10 – Friday – Holy Day of Obligation – Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Parish Masses at 5:30 and 7am. One Mass in Winnisquam at 9am (Father penciled in should have had two masses (8 and 10.)

August 17 – Lawn party will continue Friday and Saturday with drawing of raffle tickets on Saturday evening. Members of the committee will call you to collect ticket stubs and money between today and Wednesday. Kindly cooperate by having everything ready for them. Door prizes will be given every night. A special attraction, a kiddies' ride, will be added on the grounds for next Friday and Saturday evenings. Next Friday – Feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary – Mass at the Chapel in Winnisquam at 8am – no Mass in Belmont.

1965: November 14 – Father Arthur L. Massicotte died suddenly. Funeral was on November 17. Newspapers said, "there were many tears shed for the man who had become a warm friend to the community as a whole." This was Father's first assignment as Pastor. At the expressed wish of Father, there was no eulogy. Father had a great devotion to St. Therese de Lisieux which he shared with his parishioners. He considered the relic of St. Therese de Lisieux his most precious gift.

November 14 – Father Karl Dowd was assigned temporary Administrator.

November 17 – Father Arthur O. Houle was named Administrator for 6 weeks.

1966: January 19 - Reverend Robert J. Larouche was named Second Pastor.

Born: August 25, 1916, in Nashua, New Hampshire. Father Larouche was the sixth child of 16 children, 11 boys and 5 girls. Parents: Alfred and Ernestine (Lafrance) Larouche. Father's surviving sisters are: Sister Mary Agnes, Monastery of the Precious Blood, Manchester; Oliva Beaulieu; Rose Leaor, Gertrude Labednick all of Nashua. His surviving brothers are: Rosaire Larouche of Nashua and Armand Larouche of San Pablo, CA.

Education: St. Louis de Gonzague 1-8; Assumption Prep 8-12; St. Mary Seminary in Baltimore, Maryland. He was ordained on April 10, 1943.

Parish Assignments: May 6, 1940 – St. Joseph, Berlin; December 9, 1943 – St. Augustine, Manchester; November 3, 1960 – Woodsville, Pastor; January 19, 1966 - St. Joseph, Belmont, Pastor; June 25, 1975 – St. Leo, Gonic, Pastor.Appointment/Special Assignments/Additional Ministry: June 3, 1951 – Diocesan Scout Chaplain – 9 years.

Father Larouche passed away on August 14, 1976.
